- Includes authorized and new spending over five years (fiscal years 2022 – 2026)
- Creates more than 50 new programs




\$550 billion in *new spending* over five years (FYs 2022 – 2026) above current baseline levels, including:

- Transportation: \$284 billion
- Power and Grid Infrastructure: \$65 billion
- Broadband Infrastructure: \$65 billion
- Drinking Water and Infrastructure: \$55 billion
- **Resiliency:** \$47 billion
- Environmental Remediation: \$21 billion
- Western Water Infrastructure: \$8.3 billion

\$650 billion in *authorized spending*, including a \$383.4 billion, five-year surface transportation reauthorization package

Western Water Infrastructure, \$8.3









Water Infrastructure Funding

Western Water Infrastructure

Aging Infrastructure

• Authorizes \$3.2B for the Aging Infrastructure Account to finance the non-federal cost-share for Reclamation-owned water infrastructure projects

WIIN Act Storage

 Authorizes \$1.15B for water storage, groundwater storage, and conveyance projects, including \$100M for small surface water and groundwater storage projects

Timing of Funding

- Depends on the program
- New vs. existing program including status of appropriations
- Competitive program vs. formula program
- Funding will be available for five years
