


The SWP Helps Overcome Uncertainty and Achieve our Mission





The Return on our Investment in the SWP has Declined Over the Last 30 Years With an Uncertain Future
















Background

History

- Part of the State Water Project design and included in the 1957 CA Water Plan
- 1980s
 - State Water Project Stage II sent to voters
 - Peripheral Canal
 - Sites Reservoir
 - Did not pass
- 2000
 - Included in CalFed Bay-Delta Program
 - North-of-Delta Offstream Storage (NODOS) Project (2001)
 - DWR lead agency for CEQA
 - BOR lead agency for NEPA
 - Did not move forward due to lack of <u>local support</u>

History

- 2010
 - Senate Bill 7X 2, the Safe, Clean, and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act
 - This law allows for the formation of joint powers authorities by cities, counties, irrigation districts, and other local water districts and agencies within the applicable hydrological region for the design, acquisition, and construction of water infrastructure, ecosystem, water supply reliability, and other types of specified water projects. The Authority currently is composed of public entities located and operating in the Sacramento Valley (namely, City of Roseville, Colusa County Water District, County of Colusa, County of Glenn, Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, Maxwell Irrigation District, Orland-Artois Water District, Placer County Water Agency, Proberta Water District, Reclamation District 108, Tehama-Colusa Canal Authority, Western Canal Water District, and Westside Water District)
 - Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) amongst local agencies
 - Sites Project Authority






Proposed AB and RC Voting Procedures

Routine Matters:

Majority of the total number of Directors.

New Members: 75% of member home boards.



Weighted Voting: Each participant's vote is based 50% on occupying a seat and 50% on participation percentage.

Routine Matters:

Majority of the total weighted vote.

AB: **At least 75%** of the total number of Directors.

Shared Decision-making

Requires the approval of both the AB and RC.

RC: At least 75% of the total weighted votes.
