Board Resolution Champions Federal and State Executive Orders

Orders Deliver Much-Needed Water Resources to Pass Area

BEAUMONT, CA (February 19, 2025) – The San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency (SGPWA) underscored critical water supply needs in California — including fire response, water storage, and groundwater recharge — in a Board resolution adopted on February 3, 2025. The SGPWA Board of Directors supported a water-focused Executive Order from President Donald Trump and one from Governor Gavin Newsom enabling maximized storm flow diversions.

President Trump's Executive Order, titled "Emergency Measures to Provide Water Resources in California and Improve Disaster Response in Certain Areas" and delivered on January 24, 2025, aids California's ability to fight and prevent massive wildfires and increases water deliveries to Southern California.

SGPWA is a State Water Contractor located at the end of the line for State Water Project (SWP) deliveries, and the President's Executive Order bolsters the Agency's efforts to secure a reliable water supply for a rapidly developing region.

"The Agency is grateful for this swift response to vital water issues in California," SGPWA Board President Mickey Valdivia said. "We are happy to support the federal, state, and local agencies tasked with implementing both Executive Orders' directives in any way they may need."

Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-16-25, delivered on January 31, 2025, directs the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and other state agencies to maximize diversions of excess stormwater from incoming winter storms. These flows will be used to boost water storage in Northern California and replenish above-ground and groundwater storage across the state.

For SGPWA, the Governor's Executive Order strengthens its ability to preserve regional groundwater resources for current and future generations. This Executive Order enables the Agency to manage groundwater sustainably and move closer to ending local groundwater overdraft.

Through backing these Executive Orders, SGPWA hopes to achieve significant goals for the Pass area, including:

- Addressing the SWP's aging infrastructure and California's lack of water storage relative to its supply
- Ensuring less water is lost to environmental flows to the ocean
- Putting an end to water shortages, largely driven by regulatory constraints that have reduced imported water supplies and exacerbated California's housing crisis
- Support for California farmers that have fallowed hundreds of thousands of acres of fields due to reduced water supply, rising water costs, and increasing regulatory burdens
- Stronger fire response infrastructure due to the Pass area's risk of wildfires in the future
